About Topaz

For 20 years, Women in Film Dallas has provided a platform for independent female filmmakers to promote their work through its annual film festival. Originally named Chick Flicks and subsequently known as Flicks by Chicks, we changed the name in 2019 to Topaz Film Festival to better reflect the spirit of our film competition and the history of our organization. The name Topaz comes from the official gemstone of Texas, which was thought in ancient times to enhance visions. In 1987, WIFD established the Topaz Award to honor distinguished Texas women who, through their own visions, have made outstanding contributions to film and television history. With the Topaz Film Festival, we strive to honor past Topaz Award recipients and the vision of new independent female film makers.

The Topaz Film Festival is an extension of the Women in Film Dallas Scholastic Grant Fund, a 501c3 that provides financial support through grants and scholarships to women in the pursuit of media arts degrees and those in the productions of film, television and screen-based media. Proceeds from the festival will serve to fund the scholastic grant.

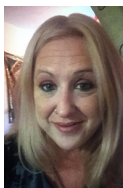

Dr. Cheryl Polote-Williamson is a highly sought after transformational speaker, nationally acclaimed multi best-selling author, award winning executive producer and filmmaker, global business leader, visionary, philanthropist, brand influencer, purpose connection coach, editor-in-chief of Cheryl Magazine and most importantly, a true servant leader. Cheryl has mastered the art of influence and she takes pride in teaching others how to do the same.

As a transformational speaker with unbelievable transparency and candor, Williamson's speeches captivate and motivate audiences to release self doubt, walk in power and thrive in purpose. Earlier this year, she was honored to serve as the Convocation Keynote Speaker at Shaw University's Founder's Day ceremony.

Cheryl's highly acclaimed literary works, with titles like, *The Success Factor: Stories from Successful Entrepreneurs Who Thrived After Facing Failure*, granted her the opportunity to be a featured author at the 108th NAACP National Convention. Upon achieving literary success, Cheryl was inspired to embark on a journey in executive producing a documentary. Polote-Williamson is the embodiment of what it means to have a servant's heart. In 2018, she founded Soul Reborn, a 501 (c)(3) non-profit charitable organization that educates individuals and communities on the positive impact of business creation.

Since its inception, Soul Reborn has supported more than 4,500 disenfranchised, underserved and previously incarcerated women. Most recently, her philanthropic efforts garnered the attention of the White House, adding the President's Lifetime Service award to her growing list of awards and accomplishments. Cheryl's philanthropic efforts have also been recognized by the state of Ohio, where she received a Proclamation for philanthropy. Also, Rosemary's Babies, an Ohio home for teen moms, named a gallery in Cheryl's honor. Additionally, Cheryl serves her community through affiliations including Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority Incorporated (Alpha Xi Omega Chapter), The Links Incorporated (Mid Cities Chapter) and Black Women in Media.

Through her dedication and commitment to excellence in global business leadership, Cheryl graduated from the Goldman Sachs 10,000 Small Businesses program, which helps entrepreneurs create jobs and economic opportunities by providing access to education, capital and support services. Additionally, she holds Women's Business Enterprise National Council (WBENC) and Historically Underutilized Business (HUB) certifications. Cheryl's influence in business has placed her in the position to impact change in the lives of thousands. Through that influence, Cheryl has launched thriving online communities that have inspired an upwards of 500 authors, volunteers, entrepreneurs and fellow philanthropists.

Cheryl is honored to have received multiple international media features, including: Black Enterprise, Forbes, Sheen, Ebony, Heart & Soul and Rolling Out Magazines. She has also been featured on multiple media outlets including: Good Day LA, Fox, Fox Soul, MSNBC, Christian Women in Media, ABC News, CBS, CEO Money Show and Sister Circle Live. Additional awards received this year include: the Maura Women Serving Women Award from Texas Women's Foundation, Self-Published Author of the Year Award from the African American Literary Association, Trailblazer Award from Black Women in Media, Servant Award from Ordinary People Magazine and the Women in Business Leadership Award from Pull Corp.

Through her speeches, literary works, online communities, philanthropic efforts, business and servant leadership, Dr. Cheryl Polote-Williamson has successfully cultivated a purpose centric global movement that is founded on helping others connect to and live their purpose authentically and unapologetically. She has sparked a contagious ripple effect that has inspired and empowered others to find what they are passionate about and pursue it relentlessly.



Dorothy Malone Legacy Award

Dorothy Malone, born as Dorothy Eloise Maloney, was an American actress best known for her Academy Award winning role in the film 'Written on the Wind.' Raised in Dallas, she was one of five children born to an accountant father and housewife mother. Attending Ursuline Convent and Highland Park High School, she was quite popular (as "School Favorite"). She was also a noted female athlete while there and won several awards for swimming and horseback riding. Following graduation, she studied at Southern Methodist University with the intent of becoming a nurse, but a role in the college play "Starbound" happened to catch the eye of an RKO talent scout and she was offered a Hollywood contract.

Starting her career in 1943, she played minor roles in her early years, particularly in B-movies. She initially got signed by RKO and made appearances in the movies 'Higher and Higher', 'Seven Days Ashore', 'Show Business', 'Step Lively' and 'Youth Runs Wild'. She changed her surname from Maloney to Malone after getting signed by Warner Bros. She then went on to act in the films 'The Big Sleep', 'Janie Gets Married', 'Night and Day' and 'To the Victor'. The actress' film career reached greater heights by the early 1960s, and she even managed to achieve fame as a TV actress with her role as Constance MacKenzie in the series 'Peyton Place'. The American beauty was also known for making guest appearances in several TV programs. She guest-starred in a number of television shows, such as 'The Bold Ones: The New Doctors', 'Ironside', 'Ellery Queen', 'Four Star Playhouse', 'Fireside Theater', 'The Loretta Young Show', 'The Untouchables', 'Cimarron City', 'Dr. Kildare' and 'The Dick Powell Show', to name a few. Malone did numerous television movies in her acting career as well, the popular ones being 'Katie: Portrait of a Centrefold', 'Murder in Peyton Place', 'Peyton Place: The Next Generation' and 'The Pigeon'.

Dorothy's last film was a cameo in the popular thriller Basic Instinct (1992) as a friend to Sharon Stone. She retired to Texas and died in Dallas shortly before her 94th birthday on January 19, 2018. She is survived by her daughters Mimi and Diane.

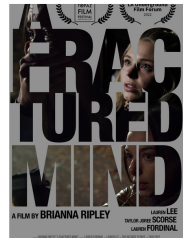

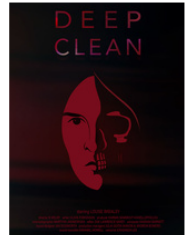

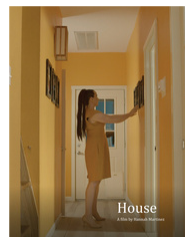
A woman prefers her dog to her husband. What will he do?

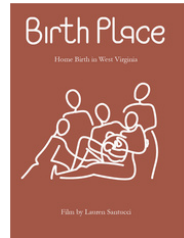
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Birth Place: Home Birth in West Virginia
